1. ATGENDER Spring Conference 2016,

'Spaces of Feminist Learning & Teaching. Queering movements, translations, and dynamics.' Utrecht, April 21 – 23

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Organised by <u>ATGENDER</u> and the Graduate Gender Programme Utrecht University, the 2016 edition of the <u>ATGENDER</u> Spring conference is dedicated to

spaces of feminist learning & teaching. The focus of the conference is on teaching and learning in queer and gender studies' classrooms, broadly understood as spaces inside and outside the university, traversed by multiple urgencies and agendas and informed by complex negotiations at personal, social, economic and political levels.

The conference wants to stimulate active and reciprocal exchanges between researchers, activists, students, educators, graduates, information specialists and those professionally engaged with gender studies and feminist research. We want to address issues related to learning and teaching of gender in many possible contexts. We invite those interested in feminist debates and practices of teaching gender in and beyond Europe to join us in a series of exciting panels, workshops and other events. The conference experience will be deepened by free training sessions, a wild social program, and creative mind/body activities in the city of Utrecht.

We hope to provide a platform for the contributions of many **ATGENDER** members! If you become **ATGENDER** member, your conference fee will be reduced from $\[\in \] 200 \]$ to $\[\in \] 100 \]$ or (students and unemployed graduates) $\[\in \] 50.$ There are also travel grants available for presenters – you can apply while you submit your abstract for the conference!

Remember that institutions that are part of **ATGENDER** can grant to up to three people the same rights as any individual member (i.e., reduced fee for

conference, 1 copy of our latest publication, 1 vote at our General Assembly, etc.). So, convince your institution to become member of **ATGENDER** for 2016 too!

ATGENDER will soon be launching a new electronic mailing list (Listserv **ATGENDER**) to eventually replace our weekly newsletter as this allows more interactive exchange. 
When the listserv is running the weekly news will eventually be closed.

3. Teaching with Feminist Materialisms is now available online!

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We are pleased to announce that *Teaching with Feminist Materialisms* (2015), the latest volume of **ATGENDER**'s *Teaching with Gender* book series, is now available for (free) download from the **ATGENDER** website. Teaching with Feminist Materialisms is edited by Peta Hinton and Pat Treusch and maps European feminist materialisms across a diversity of classrooms, demonstrating the contribution these current approaches make in

thinking and transforming pedagogical praxis. As a growing and wide-spanning field of research, teaching, and collaboration, feminist materialisms are taking up increasing space in our pedagogical settings, especially in queer and feminist classrooms. Whether as a theoretical topic, as a methodological strategy for conducting research, or in developing learning tools, feminist materialisms work

to foreground the complex forms of relation and accountability that mark processes of inquiry, and to re-imagine the already innovative feminist classroom experience. A strong part of this contribution of feminist materialisms is the turn to the very materialities at play in knowledge production, and as these take into account the intrinsically entangled human and more than human actors that operate in and alongside the classroom, and the bodies, spaces, practices and knowledges co-produced there.

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6. 9th European Feminist Research Conference 'Sex and Capital', June 2015

Over 300 visitors from 34 countries participated in the 9th European Feminist Research Conference in Rovaniemi, Finland, 3–6 June 2015. The theme of the conference was 'Sex & Capital' and the topics included the role of feminism in the economic crisis, engaging with recent feminist thinking on gender politics, economics and futures. Conference delegates discussed questions such as: 'What are the different, sexualized forms of capital?' 'What are the gendered dynamics and outcomes of barefaced capitalism?' and 'How should we understand and reconceptualise material realities, embodiment and subjectivities?' Researchers and professors, a lot of young PhD and other students, brilliant key note speakers and a fantastic academic and social program under the Northern sun ensured a great success of the Conference.

The Conference was organised by **ATGENDER** together with the University of Lapland. The Conference was the occasion to meet feminist colleagues around the world, create new networks and discuss current issues concerning research, study, teaching, information, and activism. There was a great diversity among the participants, both geographically and in age.
